#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM MCERA:**

MCERA currently requires members to submit certified copies of vital records for both themselves, and any beneficiary named to receive a continuance of the member's retirement benefit after death. Vital records include the following:

- Original or Certified copy of the Member's Birth Certificate, or Passport, or Passport card, or CA Real ID.
- Original or Certified copy of the Spouse/Registered Domestic Partner's Birth Certificate, or Passport, or Passport card, or CA Real ID.
- Original or Certified copy of the Member's Marriage Certificate or State Certificate of Registration of Domestic Partnership.

Retired members who retired before this requirement should submit these documents to MCERA as soon as time allows. Providing these documents now will save your surviving beneficiary from having to provide these documents later.

### DUES INCREASE! MPORTANT ARTICLE – PLEASE READ

#### DUES INCREASE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

Our treasury is the lowest it has ever been due to the rising costs of everything. We could barely pay out the four scholarships for the 2022/2023 year. AMCRE Board of Directors has charged \$1.00 per month per retiree since the organization was formed. Due to rising costs of stamps, printing and mailing of our newsletter, and maintaining our website, AMCRE Board of Directors voted on Monday, April 10, 2023, to increase our membership dues from \$1.00 per month per retiree to \$2.00 per month per retiree. New retirees begin immediately paying \$2.00 per month to join AMCRE. Most of the retiree associations in the State of California raised their dues this year because of costs going up. We have made many changes to help our treasury grow again; starting with everyone will receive the newsletter via email unless they filled out the form requesting a mailed hard copy. That will save quite a bit of money. On that note, in this newsletter please tear out, fill out and sign a new affidavit agreeing to have your dues voluntarily increased to \$2.00 per month. According to MCERA, they are not legally allowed to take an additional amount from your pension checks unless you sign the enclosed affidavit just as you had to sign for the \$1.00 amount to join when you retired which is currently on file at MCERA.

AMCRE is working with Mendocino County Employees Retirement Association (MCERA) to change all the pertinent paperwork for new retirees and the current retirees. We thank all of you in advance for your understanding and cooperation in returning this affidavit as quickly as possible to keep the paperwork accurate. Should you have any questions regarding the signing of this affidavit, please contact MCERA at their office.

One important item that must be mentioned: You are required to maintain membership in AMCRE to have coverage under any Pacific Agency Group plans and coverages may be terminated without warning should your AMCRE membership lapse.

### ARE YOU WRITING YOUR NAME IN THE DUST ON YOUR FURNITURE? IS CLUTTER MAKING YOU CRAZY?

Here are helpful tips.

If your closets are bursting or your desk is topped with piles of disorganized papers, you may want to take some steps toward a neater home or workspace. While a bit of chaos might have some upsides -- at least one study suggests that a messy room spurs creativity -- it has many more downsides. It can even be damaging for your physical and mental health

**MESS=STRESS**: When everything is in order, you know exactly where you put your glasses and keys so you can grab them and go on with your day. That saves time and a whole lot of hassle.

IT DOESN'T GET EASIER: If you're a bit scatterbrained because your space is scattered, don't wait to neaten up. Research has shown that adults in their 50s who have too many piles of stuff are more likely than younger folks to put off making decisions about what to get rid of. The study also found that those piles can make you less satisfied with your life. Ask your kids what they want. Give it to them now if there is something they want to have and you hardly use. You will feel pleasure seeing your kids enjoying the item.

YOUR MIND WANDERS AND PASS THE TISSUES: It is so hard to focus if everything is disorganized. Do a little bit at a time to clean up, get rid of, and do your filing to clean up paperwork. People stop by unexpected and you feel embarrassed about your house. Shutting people out can take a toll on relationships and make you feel sad and lonely. Disorganization makes it harder for your brain to focus. It also makes people cry and feel anxious. A neat, tidy house feels inviting, both for the people who live there as well as guests. Dust away. Give away. Throw away. A cluttered home may feel the opposite.

**SLIPS AND FALLS**: Living with lots of clutter puts you at risk of getting injured. When your floor is covered with boxes, heaps of clothing, or even too much furniture, it's that much easier to trip. Shelves stuffed to the brim with books and knickknacks can also be a hazard if something falls off or a piece of overloaded furniture topples over. Start getting rid of books you read and probably won't pick up again. If you have a box on the floor, have someone move it to a safe location.

**UP ALL NIGHT**: A study showed that people who have a hoarding disorder also seem more likely to have insomnia. The link between the two isn't totally clear, but sleep is important for clear thinking and decision-making. If you're sleep-deprived, you might be more likely to make questionable decisions, including ones that involve getting more stuff you really don't need.
